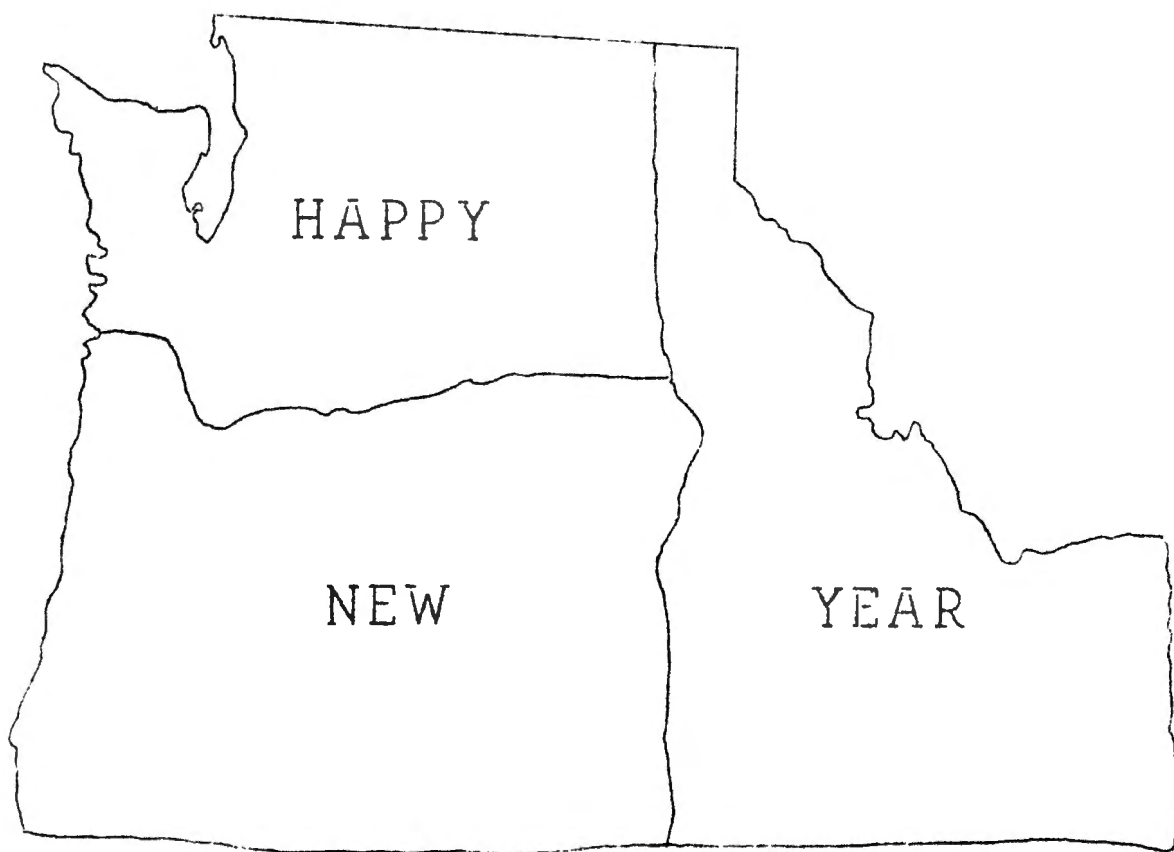

Sorry but I just haven't the courage to reorganize the carefully written out score table received from Mike Potoma into the order of finish - anyone who thinks I should have done so go ahead and write out one for yourself with my blessing.

SKABEIKIS, VOGLER, and BERRY were only separated by tie-breakers for 1st, so Russ Vogler had to be content with his 1/3 share of the prize money but no trophy. Dave Ratkowsky and S. McKibbin tied for the under-1600 prize, and were also tied after application of tie-breakers, so they split the money and tossed for the trophy. Dave won the toss. George Beck won the unrated \$5. Monahan and McKibbin came up from Washington and finished 9th and 8th, but were unable to recapture any of the foreign exchange rounded up by some of the recent punitive expeditions south of the border by Canadians. The U.S. balance of payments surplus for October was only \$116 million, and Washington chess players aren't helping out very valiantly.

## COMPARISON OF RATINGS

To fill out the page, here are some statistics I recently extracted from a comparison of the NWCL and Canadian rating lists for mid 1967:

Class A and higher WCF rating average 10 points lower

Class B WCF average 20 higher (for a given player with both)

Class C no difference for the average player.

30% of players checked had WCF and Canadian ratings within 20 pts.

When will FIDE stop beating about the bush on the recording of moves, and make it clear to players that if they do not record properly they will be defaulted?

Here is an interpretation given by the Permanent Commission of the Rules at the 1967 Congress:

"During the course of the game, the two players, under extreme time pressure, did not write down their moves after move 30. After a series of moves, they agreed that they had played at least 40 moves. Being unable to reconstruct the course of the game without a chessboard, they asked permission of the Arbiter to reconstruct the game. The Arbiter gave permission and the reconstruction started. The Arbiter stopped the clocks, but during the course of the reconstruction, the clock of the black player was started by the white player, because the black player had started to reflect. At the beginning of the reconstruction the black player disposed of one minute and a half for reflection. During the reconstruction this player exceeded the time limit and it was discovered that he had made only 39 moves."

The Commission decided: As no other details are available, the Commission's opinion is that white won the game.

Does it not seem to you that black was psyched out of this game by the quick thinking of his opponent?

This kind of argument could not arise if all players knew before the game started that recording really is mandatory. At the moment, the rules as interpreted actually encourage time scrambles.

In another ruling, the Commission decided that an Arbiter should refrain from calling a player's attention to the fact that he has neglected to stop his clock, or to the fact that the opponent has made a move and put the clock of the other player in motion.

Another ruling dealt with the method

of applying the Sonneborn-Berger system in the case of a tie in a team tournament. This is rather complicated, and I guess of interest only to T.D.'s so if anyone is interested in details drop me a line and I will be pleased to send you a copy.

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AMERICAN OPEN

Dr. Anthony Saily won the eight-round American Open at Santa Monica with a  $7\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$  score, only drawing with U.S. Open Champion Pal Benko. Benko, of New York, and John Blackstone of San Francisco tied for second with 7-1 scores in the field of 133 players from all over U.S., Canada and Venezuela. Former U.S. Junior Champ Walter Browne, of New York and now of Los Angeles, placed fourth with  $6\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ .

Pacific Northwest was represented by Victoria, B.C., expert Ray Kerr, who finished in a multiple tie for fifth with a 6-2 score. He lost to LA master Tiber Weinberger (rating 2,348), drew with Blackstone (2,312) and Jim Pruner of LA (2,318) and beat Dave Gross of San Francisco (2,284) for a split with 4 masters. Kerr also beat two experts and two "A" players, finishing ahead of two international masters, including Venezuela champ Laszlo Binot, 10 masters and some 23 experts, plus the rest of the field. Kerr lost to Weinberger as Black in a wild game in the 7th round, when he was only  $\frac{1}{2}$  point out of 1st. The game should've been a draw, but it wouldn't have been any good to either player, so they both took chances and Weinberger proved superior in the complications. With two grandmasters, several international masters, some 20 masters and 30 experts, this was by far the strongest American Open ever, and possibly stronger than U.S. Open. Benko drew also with former Cal. Jr. Champ, Jim Tarjan, who finished with  $5\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$ .

REPORTING for RATING

All tournaments and private matches played for Northwest rating must be published in the NWCL to be rated. In addition to the above, the rating director should find some reduction in his work, since he will not have to go through individual pieces of mail for each match or tournament. He can do all his rating for Oregon from one monthly publication. Mr. Howard does all this rating without pay. Any method that can cut down on the necessary work should be employed.

The Oregon editor can always be blamed for not getting reports into the current monthly issue promptly after receipt from the persons reporting.

# DON TURNER WINS WHITE CITY OPEN

Don Turner topped the 20 player field to win the second annual White City Open with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  -  $\frac{1}{2}$  score. Don won over Wes McKaig, Martin Zwitzer, Scott Campbell and Sief Poulsen. His only mar came in the third round against Deane Moore with a rather bazar-like draw. There is a lot of skill required to win at chess, a lot of physiology and many tricks. However Deane Moore, although skillful, can also find a new trick now and then. In this case, the third round draw against Don Turner, he came up with a novelty at that. With only seconds left on both clocks and time controll still a few moves off, Moore with great haste and a great deal of force slammed his clock's button down. Turner's flew up and out of the clock entirely. Now Turner was not only involved in a time scramble but was also in a button scramble. The expression on Turner's face defied discription and Moore could easily get an Oscar nomination for his portrail of astonishment. Moore appeared to be helping look for the elusive button, but is suspected of trying to find it before Turner. Turner frantically looking over the table top and Moore with a deep chuckle would cause a passerby to have guessed it was a couple grown men playing button - button, Who! has the button rather than a chess tournament. Turner must be admired for his quick thinking at this point in as much as he did not waste time attempting to stop the precious fleeting seconds on his clock by smashing it. Deducing in an instant that an opponent of such cunning would have foresight enough to reinforce the innocent clock against the wrath of a panic stricken chess player. On finding the button one would have though gold had been found in White City.

Turner with lighting speed replaced the button, made his move, punched his clock, but the lost time showed, as on move 45, (Time limit  $45/2$ ) white reaching to make his move saw his flag fall. Time forfeit? No! At this point somewhere within himself fair play grasped Deane Moore (some chess players are able to suppress this outstanding quality). He stated that it could not be a

time forfeit because of the faulty clock. Turner had lost his advantage (a full rook) in the time scramble and was now left with only a draw.

This unique clock of Moore's could only be topped by Clark Harmon's flag that doesn't fall until the button has been pushed 45 times.

Sief Poulsen won the A trophy on tie breaking points with 4 -1 score. Sief won over Ned Chapin, Martin Zwitzer, Richard Cavin and Deane Moore only to lose to Turner in the crucial 5th round where he needed only a draw to win top honors. With a position that had deteriorated and added time pressure he was unable to hold out for the badly needed draw.

Richard Cavin finished 3-1 and took the B class trophy with 4 -1 score. Cavin won against Billy Chapin, Bob Mitchell (a grudge game from the whopping dished out to him in the Idaho Open.), Jerome Lee and Warren Padelford. Losing only to Poulsen in the 3rd round. Wes McKaig took class C trophy with a 3-2, winning from Ben Horn and Roy Wilson, with draws from Lew Hill and Warren Padelford. Class D and unrated trophy went to Dick Pex, who scored 2-3 (The only unrated player in the event.) Pex had first and last round wins from Dave Mitchell and Billie Chapin.

Top scoring junior was Warren Padelford with  $2\frac{1}{2}$  -  $2\frac{1}{2}$  score; winning against John Narcisi and Dick Pex and a 3rd round draw from Wes McKaig.

The tournament was sponsored by the Rogue Rooks Chess Team and directed by Richard and Yvonne Cavin, assisted by just about everybody.

There were also two editorials about problems the Washington Chess Federation had with the first issue of Washington Chess Letter. The Washington Chess Letter reported Edward Arnold was elected president of Seattle Chess Club. J. Leonard Sheets won State Championship by downing Charles Joachim in a tie-breaking match 2-1. J.A. Naas is leading Everett Chess Club tournament 20-0. It was a double round robin with 22 players. Neil Powers was 2nd at this point. Seattle Lead PSL 3-0 score.

## JANUARY 1953

Elmars Zengalis won the state Speed Championship with 8-1 score. Dan Wade placed 7th Puget Sound League lead is held by U of Wash and Tacoma YMCA both with 4-0 match scores. Seattle YMCA is right behind with 3-1 score. 166 copies of Washington Chess Letter were run off the month with about 130 going to paid up members. A match between Portland-Seattle was in the works. One of the problems was going to be the lack of chess clocks. The match would take place in Centralia. O. W. Manney and Chas. Ballantine were the top scoring players so far in Puget Sound League play with 5-1 records. Greene was top rated postal player.

## JANUARY 1958

Lost my 1958 annual so no report on this.

## JANUARY 1963

Gerald Ronning won 30 player Washington Open with  $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$  score just ahead of Ivars Dalbergs 5-1. This is the event with the infamous McCormick-Suttles double forfeit. This tournament was also last held in Seattle YMCA. Leslie Vitanyi won 24 player reserve section. Gerald Schwarz won Northwest Jr. Black Bandits won Puget Sound League 6-0 scr.

The pairings for candidate matches are out. In group one Bent Larsen is pitted against Lajos Portisch while Boris Spassky takes on Eufim Geller. The winners of these two matches play with that winner pitted against winner of group two series. Group two has Mikial Tal against Svetozar Gligoric plus Victor Korchnoi will play the winner of playoff between Samuel Reshevsky, Leonid Stein and Vlastimil Hort. The winner of this whole series will play a 24 game match against the present World Champion Tigran Petrosian. The Reshevsky, Stein & Hort play will be held in Los Angeles at Herman Steiner Chess Club, probably starting around February 18th. I predict that Larsen will top Spassky in group one while Tal wins group two but Larsen will be the one to play Petrosian when the matches are over.

Walter Browne won California State Championship with a fine  $7\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ . He won 6 games and drew with Jerome Hanken, John Blackstone and Dennis Fritsinger. Tied for 2nd were Blackstone and Laszlo Binot with 6-3. The rest of the field: Charles Henin and Hanken  $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $4\frac{1}{2}$ ; Jim Tarjan 4-5; Norris Weaver and Ron Gross  $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $5\frac{1}{2}$ , Erik Osbon 3-6 and Fritsinger  $2\frac{1}{2}$ - $6\frac{1}{2}$ .

Harry Lyman won Wright-Patterson Open 5-0. Event was held University of Dayton on Ohio with only 16 players taking part.

New International Grandmaster titles awarded at F.I.D.E. Congress at Venice were: Barczay of Hungary, Gipslis of USSR, Gufeld of USSR, Zaitsev of USSR. Some of new International Masters are Mecking of Brazil, and Kaplan of Puerto Rico.

The Olympiad will be held at Lugano, Switzerland starting on October 17th, 1968. The West German Chess Federation will organize an European Individual Championship to be held in 1969. A Girls World Championship is in the works. The World Students Team Champion will start about July 10th, 1968 at Ybbs on the Danube in Austria.

E. Solyar of USSR won a minor tournament at Baltchik, Bulgaria with  $9\frac{1}{2}$  with Y. Estrin of USSR second at 9. There were 12 players. Another 12 player event found Estrin on top at  $9\frac{1}{2}$ . This one at Burgas. Liberson SR and Uhlman of East Germany tied at 11 in 16 man 4th Zinnowitz Tournament.



# high school in chess

Howie Chin's letter to Fred Howard indicated that Mr. Chin, and others as well, perhaps, are confused about the duties I have as High School Director. For these people I would like to give my interpretation of my responsibilities, prefaced by the fact that there is no stated list of duties, and that both Mr. Chin and myself have been free to choose our own methods and goals.

**Powers:** I write this column and get as much mileage, i.e. influence, as possible as being connected with the Washington Chess Federation.

**Duties:** I organize chess events as I see fit, encourage others to do the same, am available to help those who have a high school chess organizing problem, and act as an idea and information clearing house.

With this in mind, let's look briefly at some of Mr. Chin's accusations. I am supposed to have cursed high school chess with apathy by not "directing" my "staff" to send me league matches for rating purposes. By not rating matches I am preventing some people (90%) from getting ratings, offering no incentive to play chess which results in loss of talent, stagnation of a player's strength and lack of unity, furthermore it will prevent my re-election to this office.

Two high school chess leagues this year voted not to rate their matches, while one decided they did want this done. This one statement of fact shoots Mr. Chin's long series of generalizations down considerably. Last spring Chris Corwin called me to say that he might well cease playing in matches if they were rated since they were inflating his rating. Further, I think the solid satisfaction of beating someone who normally beats you is the best reward for improving your game. Lastly, I have no intention of running for this office again; the annual WCF meeting's minutes explained Howie's 22-4 vote loss to me by concluding that most members apparently felt a high school student should fill this post, and I agree.

## TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

Vincent Hikida, Auburn High School's first board has given me his first ideas on this year's Washington High School Team Championship. It will be played either April 6th and 7th or on the 6th and 13th, using two consecutive Saturdays for the six or maybe seven round event. It will be played in the Auburn High School gym. Depending on the number of entrants it will be a swiss or round robin, hopefully with an entry fee of about \$5.00. I am hopeful that the WCF will help finance one or perhaps two perpetual trophies which can be paid out of the entry fees of the next three years, allowing more for other place prizes.

## PIERCE COUNTY LEAGUE

I recieved a sheet signed by Bob Henkel from the PCL director Ron Jarmon. Ten schools, listed below, will be participating in a round robin tournament which began December 4th and will extend until the end of February. I hope to have some game results and comments from someone over there next month. PCL matches will be rated; I assume the results will be sent directly to Mr. Howard.

The annual Idaho State Championship tournament has been set for February 17-18 at the Twin Falls YWCA building. It will be a five round swiss, open to any Idaho resident, and the winner of the Class A section will be crowned 1968 Idaho Champion.

The Boise and Canyon County Chess Clubs are half way through their annual inter-club matches and Boise is leading 4-2. Complete results will appear in the next issue. Boise plans to play Twin Falls this winter also.
