# NORTHWEST CHESS

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Submissions to Northwest Chess must be typed single space within borders of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Plain white paper should be used - oil-impregnated "glossy" or "ripple" paper does not accept adhesive. Northwest Chess is printed by the photo-offset method with size reduction of  $1/3$ . Lay-up size is  $10\frac{1}{2} \times 15$ ". Crosstables that are wider than  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " should be accompanied by a column article to fit alongside. (eg., crosstable 7", story  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", always leave  $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Crosstables should include player's name and rating - place of residence should be abbreviated. Annotated games and articles are welcome. Notation may be either English Descriptive or Algebraic. Photographs for publication should be sharp and printed on high contrast paper. Tournament Announcements must include the name, date, site, entry fee, time control, registration time, prizes, and name and address of the organizer or director. They must also be typed within borders of  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Material must be mailed two to three days before the deadline. There is no mail delivery on Saturday in Canada. Until further notice,

Sir,

I write to protest the fundamentally undemocratic and unconstitutional manner in which the proceedings of the annual meeting of the HCCF were conducted, as reported in your June issue.

1) No notice whatsoever of the time and location of the meeting was given either by written notice or by announcement in NW Chess to the membership at large who have the constitutional right to be represented or to attend in person, and a number of whom, including myself, would certainly have been present had these details been given in advance.

2) The account published in NW Chess is the antithesis of the objective record of the proceedings we are entitled to expect from an extract from the minutes of such a meeting. It omits mention of who and how many attended, of who proposed all motions discussed as well as the main points of debate touched upon, nor is there any mention of a financial report being presented which is a minimum legal requirement for any society such as the BCCF. Instead, we are given a highly personal polemic, filled with innuendo and criticism of personalities, which, whether justified or not, is secondary in importance to an accurate report of the facts of the meeting. An Open Letter

Dear Sir,

I see from the June issue of Northwest Chess that a meeting purporting to be the Annual General Meeting of the British Columbia Chess Federation took place on June 3rd. at the Airport Inn, Richmond, B.C.

This meeting was not properly called as required by Article 10 - Notice of Meetings of the B.C.C.F. Constitution. (Amended). Therefore the meeting was invalid and all business conducted illegal.

In addition, it is my view that distribution of \$600 of B.C.C.F. funds to certain individuals is null and void according to Article 3 - Objects of the Association. If the Federation was wallowing in surplus funds it could perhaps be justified. At this time the Federation is short of money for its legitimate purposes and should not indulge in paying travel and other expenses for entrants to the Canadian Chess Championship. The Chess Federation of Canada was the proper organization for such largesse.

Furthermore, the indiscriminate use of proxies is, to the best of my knowledge, contrary to Article 11 - Voting

The Treasurer advised that further expenditures would be made prior to 30 June 72 and an audit would then be taken. There were a number of expenses listed for the current year however a complete statement will follow at year end.

A report on the Chess Store was received next from W. CROOKES and advised that only a few items remained in stock and the current balance of the Store was \$299.98 to the good. The Treasurer and CROOKES got together during the break and worked out a number of differences in their records and to what accounts some items were to be charged.

The following motion was then tabled by the Treasurer:

MOTION: LONGLEY.

The Chess Store be considered a separate identity within the B.C.C.F., whose director would be considered on the executive of the B.C.C.F. and that the profits from the store each year would be donated to the B.C.C.F. at the Annual General Meeting. The debts incurred if any at year end shall be paid by the B.C.C.F.

SECONDED: SNEATH

Before the vote was taken arguments were put forth against the wording of the motion and strong statements were made by WIGHT against the way the Store was run during the past year. He felt this was to be a non profit store of the Federation to assist its members to purchase equipment at a lower cost than normal retail stores. He requested to know what the purpose was if not this, and what would the policy be. It was argued back by CROOKES that several years ago when this idea of a store was set up that no profit was to be made however it was found to be loosing effort with the balance in the red each year and Council changed its opinions and agreed a small profit should be made to cover expenses, taxes, customs and the like. Proposed by MCNEE that the store should have a mark up of about 5% however argued back and forth on this point as felt if some clocks etc received damaged then prices would have to be arranged, as they are presently, to cover losses and other expenses included postage and shipping. Discussion continued until problems of the Store talked out and all opinions aired. A vote was then called for on the motion tabled.

VOTE: CARRIED. 18 against.

The amount shown was forwarded to the Washington Chess Federation for subscriptions of the 348 members in B.C. taking the magazine which was compulsory with adult memberships and optional with seniors and juniors.

The following is shown the improvement in memberships over the past couple of years and a number of reasons for this large increase. A number of tournaments which granted free entry to people obtaining their membership in the B.C.C.F. for the very first time succeeded greatly. The first one of the year was the Southern Vancouver Island Open, a Qualifying Event for the B.C. Championships, had 55 entries 34 of which joined for the first time. Some other events on both the Island and mainland also obtained a further sizable number.

The Secretary of the C.F.C., George BRYANT advised that some of the money paid in would be returned as a number of players who took out memberships during the Canadian Open were from other Provinces and those Provinces would be claiming these players to count for Governors. 50 Adult memberships equals 1 Governor in the Province concerned. He was hopeful however B.C. would be able to use the quantity of players from outside Canada in our figures. 4 Junior memberships to count as 1 Adult and 14 adult life memberships being held in B.C. As the full total is over 200 but under 250 B.C. is eligible to have 4 Governors to the C.F.C. as our Representatives. The C.F.C. Secretary advised however we may be able to have one further Governor if the C.F.C. agrees at the coming meeting in Toronto, that we can use the out of country memberships with our total.

The 71-72 totals are not complete as memberships are issued up until 30 JUNE 72, the end of the current Chess year.

Expenses incurred by the Secretary were for writing paper and envelopes, postage and money orders and new membership cards the total of which would be outlined in the Treasurers audit as more expenses were to be forwarded in for payment.

The Membership report was moved adopted as read by SCHULZ seconded by MACSKASY.  
Carried.

The Junior Chess Co-ordinators report was received next from Nigel FULLBROOK who summarized the tournaments carried out under his program advising that with the prizes for winners a required number of entries were required for each event. This goal was not always reached and in falling short a number of events had to be assisted with money for the Treasury. He reported program lost \$160 over the year. WIGHT advised that he felt the Federation could not consider the work done on the Junior Chess program a loss and that he was of the belief it was the purpose of the Federation to stimulate growth in the junior ranks and of course we would have to spend money to do this work. Council and members were in general agreement with Dave WIGHT in this respect and felt FULLBROOK did a commendable job on the program this year.

The Junior report was moved adopted as read by CROOKES seconded by KENNEDY.  
Carried.

President HANKINSON gave the Tournament Directors report advising that where tournaments with scaled entry fees and prizes were unsuccessful over the year but various tournament which allowed free entry to players getting membership for the first time did well. The various events at Simon Fraser didn't do well as the site was found to hard to get to by most players and out of the way for others. He hoped the Federation would obtain a site in a more central location for next year to draw large turn outs. Advised the Federation should lay down policy for next years rules and regulations for the running of events so all are standardized under direction of the various T.D.'s and guidance of the Tournament Committee. The meeting was told the Vancouver Inter-Club was also unsuccessful and felt that a team event run over a weekend type Tournament would be more

favourable to the Clubs. Questions were put to the President on why the B.C. Championships were forced to leave the playing site at Simon Fraser University which was the cause for some unpleasant publicity in the Victoria Newspapers. The meeting was advised the Simon Fraser had appeared to have mixed feelings against Chess Players which began to be obvious around February. At this time they began switching the playing rounds of the Tournaments and isolating them from the public access. HILL advised this attitude was possibly brought on from an incident involving a gentleman of another race who appeared about an hour late after the start of an event and wished entry for his son however advised he was to late. The President advised he started to yell alot and made quite a scene. He felt this may have got back to the University and discredited the event. However when the Security Police

advised they would have to leave after the Championships had been underway for a while and gave no explanation. MCNEE suggested a letter should be written to ascertain the reasons behind this as the President advised Tournaments would be no longer allowed at the University. It was pointed out that we did expect quite a bit considering none of the players were students attending Simon Fraser which would remove any obligation from the University.

The Tournament Directors and Presidents report was moved adopted as read by WIGHT second by MCNEE.  
Carried.

They moved on to Old Business and the President advised that there was the matter of the Printing of the December Issue which never arrived in Canada and was reprinted in February by the W.C.F. and received by our members in March. As so many complaints were received the President advised he was in contact with Rusty MILLER President of the W.C.F. on this matter and they went ahead with reprinting the issue. Advised the cost of printing was \$147 plus postage which brought it up to \$160-\$170. It was originally requested by the President

at the time to repay the W.C.F. \$100 for the expenses however the Secretary argued that this was not the fault of the B.C.C.F. that this occurred and could not see why we should be assessed more than the W.C.F. when it would have been much easier for them to extend the subscriptions of the membership concerned by one extra issue. Discussion was made on the subject by several of the members expressing their opinions and MCNEE suggested tracing the magazines through the Canadian Post Office however was advised since it originated in the state of Washington it would and was being done at the point of mailing. The following motion was then entertained.

Mr. BRYANT was in receipt of proxies from the Governors present and advised he would convey the B.C.C.F. votes on the increase to \$3 from the present \$2 for adults and .50¢ for Juniors.

LONGLEY advised while in Toronto had spoken with the editor of Chess Canada about what the magazine would do for B.C. once included in C.F.C. membership. He felt they would improve the ratings and have a regional editor from B.C. supply articles and results to be published. The ratings would be forwarded to a B.C. representative monthly to keep abreast of the changes. It was felt this could be further taken up under new business and some proposals be put forward.

The Secretary advised the ratings would be discussed at the meeting and felt some changes might be forthcoming. He further advised in regard to memberships that the B.C.C.F. would receive a cheque for members who purchased memberships at the Canadian Open in Vancouver and were from other Provinces. This would not alter our number of Governors from four and stated he would be requesting the C.F.C. meeting to allow B.C. to include out of country memberships with ours as compensation. The meeting concluded the elections for 72/73 Executive and moved on to New Business.

The matter of money for the B.C. Champion, Peter BIYIASAS, to attend the Canadian Closed by held in Toronto was first on the list. The Champion advised he was in receipt of a letter which was handed out before play in the B.C. Championships that stated the winner would receive \$300

to cover expenses for travelling to the Canadian Closed. The President advised this was highly irregular and nothing was laid down in the Constitution to cover such an award without approval of Council or vote at a General Meeting. The last such action was taken in 1969 at the General Meeting during which \$200 was awarded to the Champion for expenses to the Canadian Closed that year. The Champion advised he felt that \$200 would not be enough this year and that his Air Ticket return would cost \$265 and with food not covered by the C.F.C. \$35 would only help some what with other expenses at the site. The President advised that since this \$300 offer had already been made it would not be in good faith to reduce the amount. Some of the members did however feel this still to be too high. The three other qualifying players\*also requested some assistance with funds and several proposals were tabled to have policy laid down on a permanent basis by KIRSTEIN, however this was rejected and argued on amounts of money to be awarded.

KIRSTEIN advised the meeting he had been in contact by phone with Russell MILLER, President of the W.C.F. and publisher of NORTHWEST CHESS. They were advised of the dissatisfaction by the Kelowna and Vancouver Island areas with the magazine recently and members requested the magazine be optional for the coming year. Alex WOOD of Kelowna had also been contacted in this regard was unhappy with current policies of the magazine.

KIRSTEIN told the meeting President MILLER advised that due to the large number of subscribers this would not effect our system of ratings with NORTHWEST CHESS and news, tournament announcements and ratings would be published as previously without change. Advised that Oregon had a similar arrangement with the W.C.F. and the magazine was optional for the O.C.F.. KIRSTEIN further advised that this was not intended to replace NORTHWEST CHESS with CHESS CANADA, even if the C.F.C. passed a motion that would make CHESS CANADA inclusive with C.F.C. Membership, but that all magazines would be optional regardless of policy adopted by the C.F.C.. Points were discussed were regard to the slight increase and argued by MCNEE that with the BCCF at \$3 and CFC at \$3 the cost would remain at \$6.00 the same as it was only no magazine would be available. It was shown that previously with BCCF at 2.50 NWC at 3.50 and CFC at 2 the total cost was \$8.00 which would not be much difference except this year we are raising our fees by .50¢ and CFC raising theirs by \$1.00 to meet costs on various programs proposed.

year and should be allowed to have a Closed Qualifying Event. It was proposed the Champion be seated and 8 events be held Kelowna with an Interior Closed and Kitimat with a Northern Closed and Victoria with a Vancouver Island Closed thus insuring representatives from these areas. As well four events would be held in Vancouver, Richmond, Burnaby and New Westminster which would be open to lower mainland only. The final event would be NANAIMO which would be open to all as a final place to Qualify. A winner would be selected from the 8 man round robin held May 24th long weekend and he would enter into a match with the Champion consisting of six games the winner of which would win the Title B.C. Champion.

These proposals were argued at great length advising they would not find the best players in the Province to compete for the Championship but have some players of lesser strength come from long distances only to be completely blanked by playing the Masters of which there is sufficient number to fill the positions. In turn it was argued that we do not allow the outer areas any incentive nor a chance for their best players to test themselves against the existing masters.

The motion was seconded by KENNEDY and put forward by KIRSTEIN however WIGHT rose and advised the Meeting he would resign as Tournament Director should such a motion be passed and HARPER advised he would also resign from the Tournament Committee should this be put through. Further arguments carried on until the motion was withdrawn and no vote taken. WIGHT advising from this point on that anything to do with the Tournaments should be referred to the Tournament Committee for decision and not pushed through by proxy votes.

HILL suggested with the World Championship Match approaching alot of publicity could be gained for the Federation and Clubs by articles in the Newspapers. It was felt these articles could be printed through Chess Writers Bill RAYNER of the Sun and Paul RANGUST of the Province as well as Ray KERR of the Victoria Colonist who constantly prints articles about the Federation and its players. However, more could be gained in Vancouver than there is presently and games etc put in by contributions from our better players. It was proposed that WIGHT with the assistance of HILL and ZUK approach the Sun and Province with this in mind. They agreed.

It was proposed by WIGHT that all Tournament results be forwarded in to one person who would then take care of distribution for rating and publishing. KIRSTEIN agreed to undertake this as part of his functions as it was necessary to check the names of players in events to ensure they are members in good standing. It will be up to the individual Tournament Directors to have players produce there membership cards before entering an event. All players in an event must be members before an event can be sent forward to be rated. WIGHT suggested copies of Tournament results be forwarded to himself, NORTHWEST CHESS, CHESS CANADA, and Ratings by C.F.C. and NWC as well. KIRSTEIN advised this would be carried out.

MCNEE proposed a merger between Alberta and B.C. Chess Federations using NORTHWEST CHESS as the Magazine and combining Tournaments and the Championship. It was felt however this idea would not be workable due to the great distances and costs involved to players. He felt this would strengthen the Interior quite abit with them being closer to Alberta. 3) The decision to end the BCCF relationship with the WCF and Northwest Chess (and presumably with NW ratings) is one of basic significance which is now imposed on the membership from above and without any possibility of discussion at the grassroots. Whatever the nominal legality of this decision (and this I feel is brought into question by the points mentioned above), a change which affects the whole fabric of chess in B.C. with respect to finance, tournament organization, ratings, and magazine subscription, has been engineered through the whim of an individual or group, an action which smacks of a most arbitrary and undemocratic abuse of elected power. The fact that a restriction of proxy use was subsequently passed at the meeting only highlights how unethical was its previous application.

4) The manner in which such a large sum as \$600 was disbursed to the qualifiers in the Canadian Closed indicates that the federation is being run as an elitist group for the benefit of a few and not for the general membership. While by no means opposed to a degree of support for the province's representatives in major events as has been traditional in the past, it is relevant to ask a few questions about other equally worthy uses to which this money might have been put. Why were there no funds to pay a modest honorarium for our long-suffering tournament director or to rent sufficient and centrally-located premises for tournaments held on the Lower Mainland? Is the Federation not capable of supporting a single tournament (count 'em!) in this area for the membership at large during the five months from May to September. (To its credit, one ~~has~~ been held and another is scheduled on the Island) What has happened to the program for supporting junior or high school chess? Was it necessary to rent (if this was indeed the case?) premises at the Airport Inn for such a select gathering, when in the past annual meetings have often been held in the home of some member of the executive? The article indicates that membership fees will rise due to the link with the Canadian Federation, and if there is to be no magazine, what benefits in the form of better or more accurate ratings, more tournaments and the like, are going to accrue to the average chessplayer? These facts we are not told.

It has often been said that people and organizations get the leadership they deserve, and no doubt apathy on the part of the membership (myself included) has contributed to this sorry situation. The fact that Mr. Hankinson has run the magazine, much of the federation's business, and directed tournaments almost singlehandedly during the past year is to his credit, but it is heartening to see that some more reasonable division of responsibilities has reportedly been set out by the meeting. Nevertheless, I, for one, can have no confidence in the present executive body unless we are assured of some sort of fiscal responsibility which represents a consensus of how most members want their dues spent and not the manipulations of a small group of semi-professional players who wish to reserve all the gravy for themselves. Further, I call for a mail vote among the general membership on the question of federation affiliation; the WCF has consistently submitted questions of a fundamental nature to such a test, and, whether or not a large response be forthcoming, this seems far more democratic than the highhanded decisions we have witnessed.

If there are omissions or oversights in my view of the situation, I readily apologize for them, but the reported proceedings in the magazine can only lead to the conclusion that the power of the executive has been badly abused.

## THE RATINGS GAME, or

More than you ever wanted to know about ratings.  
By Bruce Bailey, NW Rating Director

The purpose of this article is to amuse, divert, and maybe even inform you about Northwest ratings. Let's start with some general information. If you already know all about it pardon me, but I am sure at least some of our many new members have never had the opportunity to get their questions answered. This article is dedicated to them.

First off, our rating system is the same as that used by the United States Chess Federation. It was devised some years ago by Professor Arpad Elo, Chairman of the USCF Ratings and Pairings Committee. It is a predictive system in which the difference between two ratings measures the difference between the two player's strengths. For instance, a difference of 100 points means that the higher rated player has a 61% chance of winning a single game, or, phrased better, in a 100 game match he should score 61 points. Here are his percentage expectancies for other rating differences:

200 points, 73%. 300 points, 80%. 400 points, 88%. And so forth. This of course is a statistical expectation which does not take into account either player's learning during the match, personality factors, etc., but it gives you some idea of what a rating difference means. The scale of values runs from about 700 clear up to 2450 - local values. In the USCF rating pool Bobby Fischer has reached 2825, a fantastic rating.

On our more mundane level let's look at the distribution of rating points among Northwest players. I currently have 1447 players on my computerized file, of which 670 are established and the remaining 777 are provisionals. (What's the difference? An established player has played 16 or more rated games, a provisional player fewer than 16. In rating lists provisional ratings are marked with an asterisk following the rating.) The average rating of the established players is 1730, that of the provisionals is 1411. This just reflects the fact that provisionally rated players are, by definition, novices at tournament play. There are 19 Masters (2200 and over), of which 15 are established, while of the 87 Experts (2000 through 2199) only 11 are Provisionals. Turning to the other end of the scale all 45 of the players rated under 1000 are Provisionals, which just goes to show that experience does make a difference. On page 20 you will find a histogram showing the detailed distribution. Here's how to read it: The UNDER column shows the interval of ratings for that line. For instance, the 1600 line includes all those players who have ratings between 1575 (the entry on the preceding line) and 1599, while the 3000 line catches all those geniuses with ratings between 2400 and 2999. The COUNT column gives you the number of players in that interval. The PCNT column shows you the same thing as a percentage of all players. Finally, all those X's just show you the same information graphically - the actual number of X's on any line doesn't mean a thing, they are scaled to fit on one sheet of computer paper.

Those of you with some math will recognize the shape of the curve formed by the X's: it is of course a normal distribution. Don't be fooled by the spikes at the low end; they come about because the interval size down there is 100, compared to the 25 size used elsewhere on the chart. Actually, if you look at separate histograms for established and provisional players you would find that they are both normal distributions, but with a difference of 350 (!) points in the location of the mode. This accounts for the secondary peak around 1500 on the histogram, and also for our rather high standard deviation of 300 points. It should, of course, be 200 points, which is Prof. Elo's chosen class interval. The standard deviation in the ratings of the established players is 237, not too far off the ideal.

Enough on that. I turn now to a rather frequent question: How are ratings calculated? For a full explanation I refer you to the March 72 issue of Chess Life and Review (if there is any demand I'll detail it in NWC in a later issue), but in brief, here goes:

For provisionals and unrateds, it is just an averaging procedure. You take your opponents ratings, one game at a time, and add or subtract 400 points depending on whether you beat him or lost to him. If you drew don't add or subtract anything. Then sum up these numbers and add the total to the product of your rating times your number of games played prior to this event. Finally divide this number by your new games total (the old count plus the number of games played in this event) to get your new rating.

For established players, one must use a formula of Elo's. It is  $New\ Rating = Old\ Rating + 16 \times \text{number of wins} - \text{number of losses} + .04 \times \text{sum of the differences between your opponents' ratings and your rating, with differences greater than 350 points to be counted as 350 points}$ . The first clause in this equation measures your event performance while the second clause measures the strength of your opposition.

When an event is rated the Unrateds are processed first, then the Provisionals, using the post-event ratings for their unrated opponents, and finally the Establisheds, using the post-event ratings of their provisional and unrated opponents. This may explain why you can never calculate your own rating so that it agrees with what my computer comes up with for you. Last I will mention that the rules are different for those rated over 2400 or under 1200.

Let's turn now to the overall rating procedure. When you play in a Northwest-rated event here's what happens (or is supposed to happen). Soon after the event is over the Tournament Director sends me the cross-table. I prepare it for the computer (a keypunching chore), then put it aside with other events until it is time to prepare a monthly list for NWC. I then take all the month's events, arrange them in chronological order, and feed them to the computer. It does the actual work (in 10 seconds or less for a whole month's rating job - Vic Keiser take note). Each player in an event gets a new rating after the event is rated, so during this computer run you may have several different ratings, only one of which - the last - will be printed. However, your rating does not change after each game you play, only after each event you played in. I do not rate the events as I receive them; this is why I never know your new rating until monthly publication time. All the new ratings, and the names of the new players, are put on magnetic tape to await the next month's exercise.

I will end this article by asking all of you for a little help. When you play in an event, please give your name as it appears in NWC rating lists. If you don't like my form of your name, drop me a card and I'll change it for you - or, easier yet, just ask the Tournament Director to make a note of it on the cross-table he sends me. It only confuses things if you suddenly change from, let's say, Robert to Bob with no mention of the fact. Along the same

lines, if you should happen to get listed in NWC under two names please let me know. It's the only way I'll find out and correct it for you. The same applies to your State of residence, especially for you students who live in one state and go to school in another. Pick one of the states for your chess rating state, please. It will make my life much easier and may even get you a more accurate rating. For you Tournament Directors, keep up the timely reporting and don't forget that I need first names and states of residence, plus an indication for unrateds. I don't need the old ratings of the players, so save yourselves some effort if you want and don't send them. I let the computer do all the looking up for me.

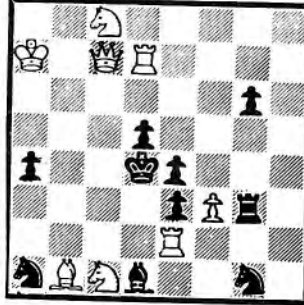

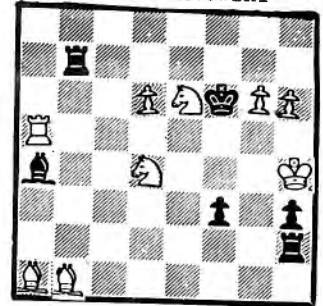

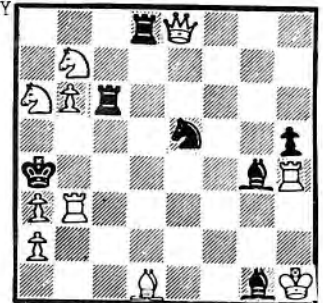
