## NORMALLY SPONSORED WASHINGTON CHESS FEDERATION EVENTS ARE UP FOR BID

The Washington Chess Federation normally runs and sponsors a number of chess events, mainly in the Seattle area. WCF officers want to see these events run in 1974. Many have a long history. We wish to receive bids from qualified tournament directors and/or organizers to hold these events in 1974. We feel these events by name and history are of value and are the property of WCF to do with what we wish and that is to hold them.

- The events are:
- Washington Open (first weekend in January) (not open for 1974 bid)
  - Puget Sound Open (to be held in April)
  - Washington Jr. Open
  - Seattle Seafair Open (to be held probably 8/3-4/74)
  - WCF Open (to be held Labor Day weekend 1974)
  - Washington Woodpusher (Northwest Rating under 2000) (held in fall)
  - Northwest Junior Open (held during Christmas Vacation)
  - Seattle Open (to be held in May-June)

Requirements: All events must be Northwest Rated, which means requiring WCF or equivalent membership. Puget Sound Open, Seattle Seafair Open and WCF Open must have an Open Section that will require USCF memberships.

NORTHWEST CHESS is distributed by third class mail usually by the 5th day of the month of issue. A 12-month subscription may be obtained according to the area of residence:

American Chess Service does not own the NWC. I would appreciate giving Oregon greater exposure in the future. In particular, I included an explanation of the prize fund for my Insanity Open which you omitted.

The above letter is from Greg Krimer of Portland, manager of the House of Chess.

I try to do my best in typing but I am not very good as most of you know. I am not going to take time to proof read every TA. I would suggest and almost demand that TAs be typed in standard format when sent in, that puts the burden on the tournament organizer. I did not type the same mistake twice, the same TA was pasted down the second month, much material is reused especially headings and page 2 month after month. I am sure I will make mistakes in the future.

I hope no one else thinks ACS owns NWC, but if each issue looks like mostly ACS material is printed that is because ACS sends in the most. I would welcome more material, especially typed and ready to paste down in proper form. I can't print what is not sent in. Phil Irwin is Oregon Editor and could use material. I don't know now just what further explanation is needed, the amounts of money are there and that is about all ACS puts on their already typed crosstables that come to me or I create of ACS events I run. As I recall this Insanity crosstable came to me when it should have gone to Phil and had to be retyped due to a number of corrections, so I or my wife typed it to fit space we had on Oregon pages, making necessary corrections.

I wish to thank Alex Wood for his fine job in past issues as BC Editor. His replacement Jon Berry is well known to NWC readers already and should do a fine job. I must point out that BC subscriptions to NWC are falling off at a rapid rate, so BC material printed will reflect space available and will be the first not printed if we lack

space. BC players are not required to receive NWC as part of BCCF membership, so they don't subscribe. WCF voted to allow this with still full access to NWC if BCCF would allow WCF/OCF members to play in BC events without joining BCCF and BCCF did this at their latest meeting but they did not go the other step which was to rate events held in BC, by Northwest Ratings. There will still be BC material in NWC but they are not giving full support. BC players are coming out on top of most of our events so there will be news of interest to BC players. The

Prize money came from those contestants who had not joined the WCF before (who were carried for free in the tournament, a practice which the Bremerton Chess Club will probably not continue).

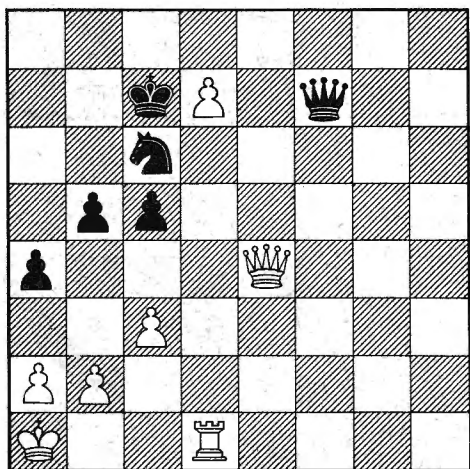
The surroundings in the YMCA were not as idyllic as those often described in CLR. During the second round a group of about eight itinerant rock musicians tip-toed through the playing area, noiselessly removing the equipment they had left behind the evening before. During the same round, a well-meaning janitor asked us to move across the hall to another room (the "judo room"), so he could set up our room for a dinner that evening. It was discovered after we had moved (of course) that the dinner had been cancelled. All was not lost, however: we discovered a bathroom that we didn't know existed, and a room that may be used for the club's regular meetings (the "judo room," not the bathroom). And all the food vending machines in the YMCA were out of order.

The day was long and exhausting: to complete a four round tournament in one day, even with a fast time limit (60/1, then 30/½), takes about 12 hours, and the players get few breaks, just enough time to make the pairings between rounds. Despite the difficult conditions, all fourteen entrants cheerfully completed all four rounds.

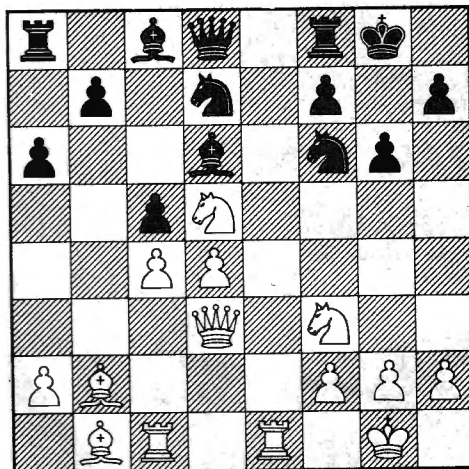

SOLUTIONS FOR NOVEMBER: No.81 (MULANE) 1.Qf4! waiting. An elegant Q-sacrifice which topples the stack of Blk.P's and the only move which provides for 1...Pe2. No.82 (BROWN) 1.Re3! (2.Qe4). Another sacrificial key, but also gives a flight: 1...Kxe3, 2.Qb6 pinmate. Some solvers said that a few mates in the variations were not easy to see. No.83 (TAFFS) 1.Rh8! (2.Re8+, Kd7, 3.Qa4 model). Other model mates occur on 1...Kd7/e7, 2.Qb7+ Ke6, 3.Re8; 1...Sf4+, 2.Bxf4+ Kd7; 3.Qe8; and 1...Pf5, 2.Pxf5+ Ke7, 3.Qb7. Not too difficult but grand play from the "G" configuration. No.84 (MAILLARD) 1.Be3 Kd3, 2.Rc5 Ke4, 3.Bf5! A miniature one-liner Ideal mate! An interesting part of this Problem is "Evacuate and Occupy", i.e. White's 2nd and 3rd moves occupy a square just vacated by another piece. No.85 (HAGEMANN) 1.Kf6! Ph6, 2.Rg5! Pxf5, 3.Kf5 Pg4, 4.Kf4 Pf3, 5.Pxf3! A startling R-sacrifice which prevents stalemate. 1.Kf5? leaves White without a tempo! No.86 (D'ORVILLE) 1.gSe5! Ke3, 2.Pc3 Kd2, 3.Sc4+ Kxd3, 4.Pb4 Kxc4, 5.Be2! A brilliant double S-sacrifice! Like fine old wine, and the connoisseurs of chess beauty will taste this one for centuries to come! No.87 (ZUCKER) 1.Kg1 Pd3, 2.Kf1 Kh2, 3.Bg2 Ph3, 4.Bh1 Kxh1, 5.Qf3+ Kh2, 6.Qg2+ Pxf2! Another Ideal mate. No.88 (KAHL) 1.Sb1 Ke2, 2.Kc1 Kd3, 3.Kd1 Rxb1! Simple? Why not a second solution: 1.Kb3 0-0-0, 2.Ka2 Rd3, 3.Ka1 Rxa3! In the hypothetical game leading up to this position, either the WK or WR must have previously moved, therefore 0-0-0 is illegal! This then is also a retro-analysis Problem, "looking backward" to justify certain elements; the same idea applies to en passant Problems. The idea goes way back at least to Sam Loyd's #2 in "Musical World" in c.1859: r3k3/plp5/Q3K3/40. 1.Qa1 (2.Qh8) and 1...0-0-0 is illegal as a defence. Note that unless it can be proven illegal, Castling is always permitted in any problem.

Anyone may enter postal chess! \$1.00 for a section, according to your class (MASTER-EXPERT, A, B, or C). If new, we start you with your Northwest Rating. If unrated, make an estimate! For matches, it is 50¢ per player. MAKE CHECK OR MONEY ORDER payable to Robert A. Karch, address given above. All events rated: 50 points to winner of each game, plus/minus 10% of the difference in the current rating (minimum 10 points to winner). If draw, lower rated player gets 10%.

From Kevin R. Chambers: "I am in favor of the Northwest Postal Chessplayers' Social. I feel that some date in March 1974 would be good, preferably in Portland."

The deadline remains January 20th for the 1974 Washington vs Oregon Postal Chess Match. The line-up will be in descending order, according to the postal ratings at that time. FREE to active players. Those with a record of a forfeit (against them) during 1973 need not apply. Already signed up for Washington: James T. Hanlen, Duane J. Polich, Kathryn H. Resing, Alan E. Torkelson, Zackery T. # USCF BY-LAWS REVISION COMMITTEE

Historic Chicago Meeting Dec 14-15, 1973

The Committee was appointed by authority of the USCF Board of Directors at its annual 1973 meeting in Chicago "...to consider major revisions of the (USCF) Bylaws..." Attending the meeting in Chicago were:

- FRANK SKOFF, USCF President, Chicago, IL
- MARTIN E. MORRISON, Chairman, Newburgh, NY
- JUDGE LACKLAND H. BLOOM, St. Louis, MO
- MAJOR ROBERT A. KARCH, Seattle, WA
- HAROLD J. WINSTON, Chicago, IL

I will omit most of the discussion, and cover only the key decisions. Chairman Morrison will soon circulate a detailed report to all USCF Directors.

Principal emphasis was to strengthen the state organizations, now to be called State Chapters, with exclusive right to represent the USCF members within their boundaries. All other clubs and organizations to be called Affiliates.

Existing Regional Vice-Presidents to serve out their terms, but no provision made for further elections to these offices.

USCF national Executive Director and Secretary become/remain paid employees without vote on the national Policy Board, to be renamed Executive Board. The Board itself expanded to six members, each with three-year terms, two up for election every year. Limit of two consecutive terms for any member.

In 1975, the first year the new by-laws would take effect (if the 300 USCF Directors, to be renamed Delegates, voted their approval at the 1974 annual meeting in New York), five members of the new Executive Board would be up for election. Current President FRANK SKOFF would be automatically on the Board. After the election, the six Board members would determine by lot who would serve the one year, two year, and three year terms.

Each year, the Executive Board would, by secret ballot, elect from among its members a President and a Vice-President, who would then serve as President and Vice-President of the entire USCF.

There were other changes, but these were the most significant. I think annual elections to the Executive Board will vitalize the entire USCF!

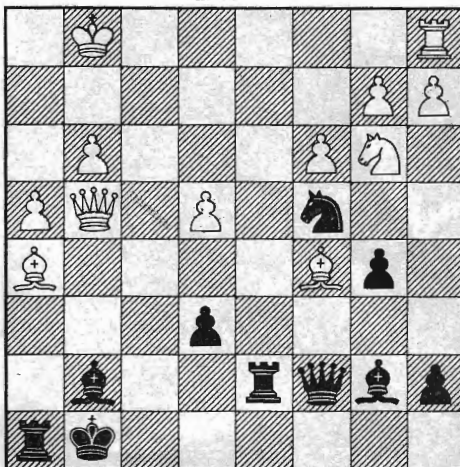

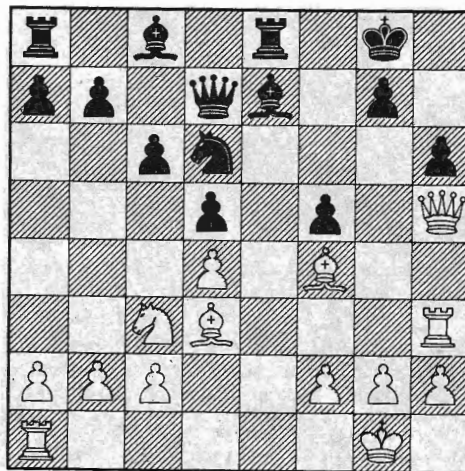

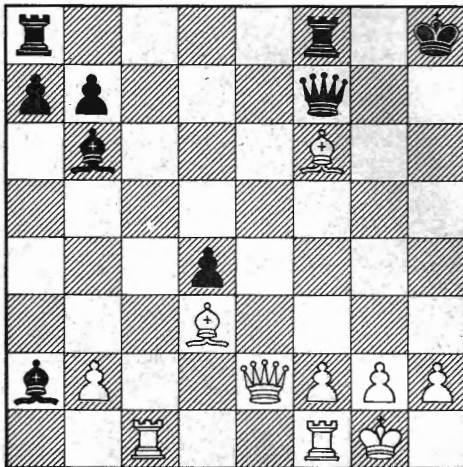

BCCF SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING 12/2/73

Council present: B. Potter, N. Fullbrook, A. Hare, B. Harper, E. Macskasy. Members present: Berry, Lemke, Morton, Zuk, Strothotte and Tate.

Motion was past to adopt the New Constitution 8-1. A brief look at the ways the constitution changes: 1. Split into Articles and Bylaws. 2. Simple majority required for bylaws. 3. Objects of Federation extended to preclude financial gain, political or sectarian activities. 4. A way to expel unworthy members has been introduced. Also a way to appeal expulsion. 5. The Presidents function has been changed from a "weak" to a "strong" position. 6. The power of the members between meetings has been reduced to a minimum. 7. The power of the Council has been increased. 8. Ways to curb the power of the Council and President were introduced into the Constitution. 9. A way to have meetings during civil strife was put in. 10. Duties of the officers have been introduced and further defined. 11. A way to replace officers who become incapacitated for any reason. 12. The financial year changed to end before the Annual General Meeting. 13. Meetings to be conducted by "Roberts Rules of Order". 14. The official organ named. 15. Officers will hold honorary posts. 16. Addition of BC Editor to official organ as officer of Federation.

It was defeated to raise dues to \$12 for Adults and \$8 for Juniors by 6-3. This would have made subscription to NWC as well as CFC bulletin a part of BCCF membership. It past to honor WCF and OCF memberships in place of BCCF membership for BC events. WCF and OCF members will have to join CFC it event requires it, just as BC players join USCF when event in USA requires it.

The following all past: BCCF pay up to \$50 hall rental for all BCCF tournaments, BCCF to receive 20% of entry fees of all tournaments under its auspices, entry fees will not be lower than \$3.00 for any player. Jon Berry was elected British Columbia Editor to the official Federation publication, NWC.

Constitution will now read (this past) The BC Championship will be a seven day event, one round each day, being an eight man round robin as per the 1971 championships with eight players drawn from eight qualifying events as determined by the tournament committee. In the event of duplication of winning events a runnerup will be selected from the second duplicating event. As well, should a player who qualifies, by winning an event, but declines to play in the Championship then a runnerup from his qualifying tournament will be selected to participate. Larry Kirstein has resigned as tournament director. A federation council meeting discussed the following

matters. Spring tournament schedule: A late January event - Fullbrook as organizer, Nanaimo event Feb 16/17 - Fred Schulz as organizer, a Late March event - Dr. Macskasy as organizer, The BC Championships possibly Easter-TD unnamed. BCCF withdrew their bid for Canadian Closed and Zonal in favor of Calgary. BCCF maybe will bid on Canadian Junior. Current BC Chess Club Affiliations were noted to be poor and the response noted and lamented. The handling of BCCF memberships will now go through CFC Business Manager to cut down on administration even at the risk of losing some control. All directors must now note that membership money must all go to the CFC - Les Bunning Box 7339, Ottawa, Ontario K1L 8E4. The same will apply to ratings which still cost \$.25 per player in the event, and the ratings will be published bi-monthly in the Bulletin. The BCCF will stop sending out membership cards and proof of membership will lie with holding a CFC membership card. A copy of CFC Bulletin is being mailed to all members for their first issue. BCCF President has numerous supplies on hand for running of tournaments, write if you need some.

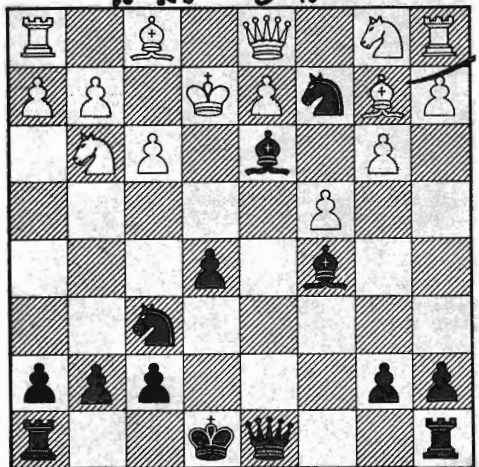

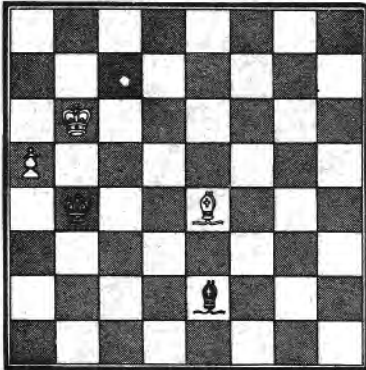

**ENDINGS WITH SAME COLOURED BISHOPS**

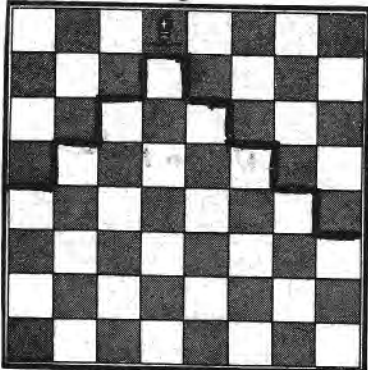


**WHITE WINS, regardless of move**

In this position the short diagonal consists of three squares. It follows that if the bishop succeeds in taking two squares and puts black in Zugzwang, then white wins. This comes about as follows: 1. Be4-b7, Be2-b5 2. Bb7-a6, Bb5-c6 3. Ba6-d3, Bc6-b7 4. Bd3-b5! b7-c8 5. Bb5-c6 and black is in Zugzwang. Note that the bishop cannot take enough free squares: It was necessary that black did not also have a free king move. Just to that end was the move 5. Bc6. On any king move, 6. Bb7 follows, as the black king has withdrawn from the pawn.

For similar positions, where the king of the weaker side prevents cutting off of the bishop's diagonal, that is, vertical opposition of the kings, it is possible to give a convenient visual rule to evaluate the position.

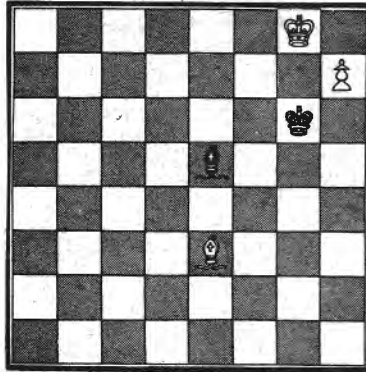

If the white pawn has not crossed the border outlined by the line a4-b5-c6-d7-e6-f5-g4-h3 with black-squared bishops, or a3-b4-c5-d6-e7-f6-g5-h4 with a white bishop, then the position will be a draw.

If the pawn has passed the stated border, then the position will be won. This is outlined in position 13. For a white-squared bishop, the diagram just looks like a mirror image, except, of course, that the colours of the squares are the same.

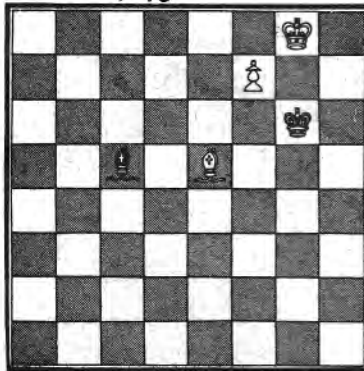

The rule has two exceptions (Position 14). In this position black draws, as the black bishop cannot be forced from the long diagonal.

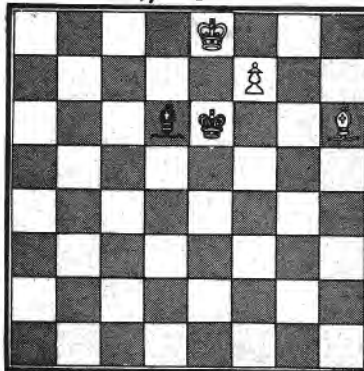

In position 15, white wins according to the rule: 1. Be5-g7, Bc5-b4 2. Bg7-f8, Bb7-d2 (Or 2... Bc3 3. Bc5, Bg7 4. Be3) 3. Bf8-c5, Bd2-h6 4. Bc5-d4 and black is in zugzwang.

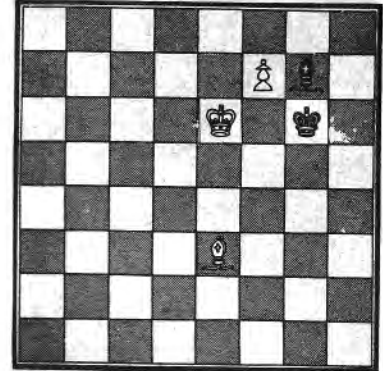

It is impossible to bring the kings correspondingly to e8 and e6, so that the result (in spite of the rule) changes. After 1. Bh6-f8, Bd6-e5, 2. Bf8-c5, Be5-g7 3. Bc5-e3, white has taken from the bishop all the free squares, but black is not in Zugzwang: 3...., Ke6-d6 4. Be3-d4, Bg7-h6 etc. Instead of 3...Kd6 possible is 3...Kf5 4. Ke7, Kg6. Wrong would be 4...Bf6+ 5. Kf8 and the king goes to g8. After 5. Ke6, yet another drawing position appears.

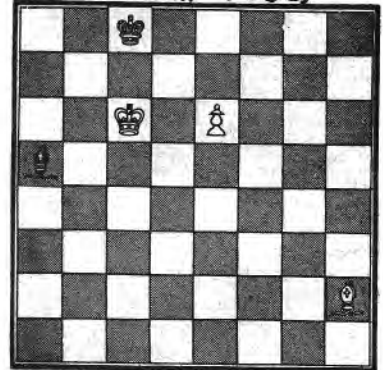

**White to play DRAW**

In position 18, white, it would seem, queens his pawn, playing 1. e6-e7, but then 1...Ba5-d8! and white cannot make a queen or rook due to stalemate. Then 2. e7-e8=N [If 2.e8=B, then 2...Ba5! 3. Bg3, Kd8 and 4...Ke7 with a draw] 2...Bd8-h4! (2...Ba5 and 2...Bg5 lose to 3. Nd6ch. On 2...Be7, there follows 3. Bc7, 4.Nf6 and 5. Nd5) 3. Bh2-c7, Bh4-e7 4. Ke8-g7, Be7-d8 5. Bc7-f4, Bd8-c7!

It is interesting that if the white bishop had been on g3, f4, or e5, then after 2. e8B, Ba5 white mates in 2. (Bd7+)

If in position 12 the black king is shifted from b4 to d6, then it turns out that this changes the appraisal of the position.

### DRAW, regardless of move

The manoeuvre Be4-b7-a6 as well as Be4-c6-b5 has not the same force, as after the trade of bishops the pawn ending is drawn.

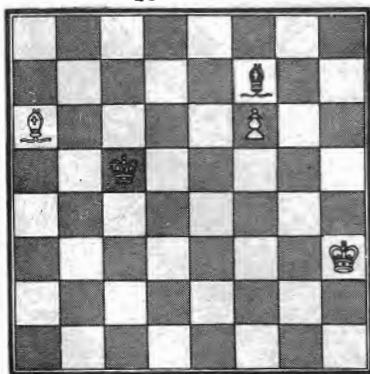
In such a case with a rook pawn the king does not always head for the rear (compare position 14). He can try for horizontal opposition if he can get a drawn pawn ending after the trade of bishops.

The knowledge of the basic positions is very important. It permits one to correctly appraise set positions, to map out a plan of attack and defence in bishops of the same colour endings with few pawns.

Analyzing, then, more complicated endings, we will try to avail ourselves of our worked-out rules.

We look at the ending of the game Romanovsky-Talvik (St. Peterburg, 1916)

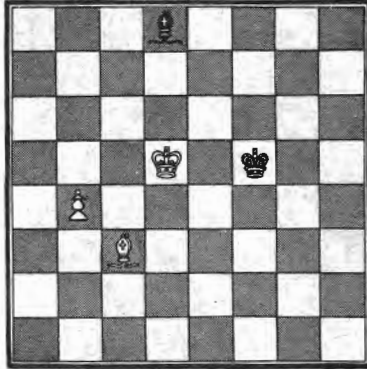

### Black to play

In the position above, from the game Capablanca-Janowsky (New York, 1916), black resigned, as he figured that because of the remoteness of his king resistance was impossible. In the book "Capablanca" (in Magyar) the following variation is given as an illustration. 1...Bc7 2. Bd4, Bd3 3. Bc5, Bc7 4. Bd6, Bd8 5. Kc6, Ke6 6. b5, Ba5 7. Bc7, Bd2 8. b6, Bc3 9. b7, etc.

This is correct, but black is not obliged to confine himself to passive tactics. The black king should have been ready to assume horizontal opposition, but vertical opposition, trying to obtain the second basic drawing position.

It turns out that black could draw.

1...Kf5-f4!! 2. Bc3-d4, (or 2. Be5+, Ke3 3. b5, Kd3! 4. Kc6, Kc4) 2... Kf4-f3!! 3. b4-b5, Kf3-e2!! 4. Kd5-c6, Ke2-d3! 5. Bd4-b6 (Or 5. Kd7, Bg5 5. b5, Kc4) 5... Bd8-g5 6. Kc6-b7! The king goes for a6! 6... Kd3-c4 7. Kb7-a6, Kc4-b3!! 8. Bb6-f2, Bg5-d8 9. Bf2-e2, Kb3-a4

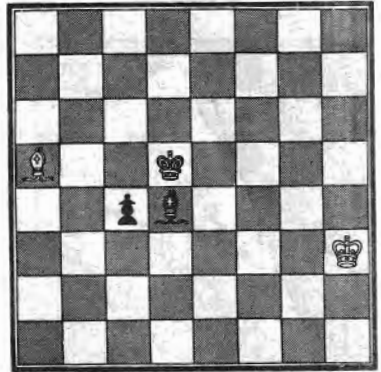
And the incredible becomes fact. In this case Janowsky resigned in a drawn position.

Curiously, if the white bishop had been on d2, white would have won. For example 1...Kg4 2. b5, Kf3! 3. Kc6!, Ke4 (black cannot win a tempo by 3...Ke2, as after 4. Bf4! Kd3 5. Bc7 he would lose even quicker) 4. Kb7!, Kd3 5. Be1! Kc4 6. Ka6, Kb3 7. Ba5, and black is a tempo short.

In closing, we note that with white to play 1. Be5

would win. For example: 1...Kg4 2. b5, Kf3 3. Kc6, Ke4 4. Bc7, etc.

We examine a position from the game Sokolsky-Lipnitsky (18th USSR Championship)

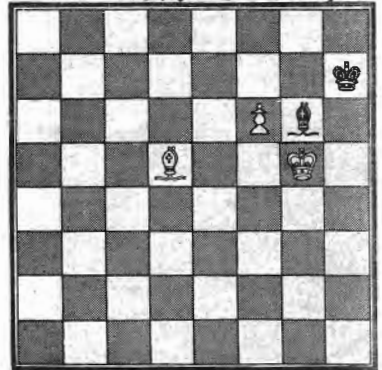

Here there was an immediate decision with 9...c3! 10. Bh6, c2 11. Kd3, Ba3

### # 23 Horwitz (1880)



### White to move & win

In this position white must move his King to e7, not allowing the black king on e5. But the immediate march with the king gets nowhere: 1. Kf4, Kh6 2. Ke5, Kg5 3. Ke6, Kf4 4. Ke7, Ke5 with a draw.

Similarly 1. Be5, Be3! (Bf5 was threatened) 2. Kf5, Kh6 3. Bb5, Bh5 (3...Bh7+ 4.Ke5, Kf6 5. f7, Kg7 6.

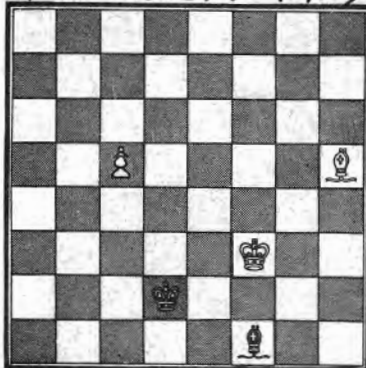

7. Ba6, Bg2 8. Bc8!, Ke7 9. Ka6. and white wins.

In this way we are able to point out the following main cases in bishop and pawn vs bishop endings.

1. If the weaker side is able to place the king in front of the pawn, on a square unavailable to the bishop, the game is drawn (First Basic Drawing Position)

2. If the weaker side is not able to occupy the square in front of the pawn; unavailable to the bishop, with the king, and if the king cannot prevent the cutting off or expulsion of the bishop, then the stronger side wins (First Basic Winning Position)

3. If the weaker side, though unable to blockade the pawn with the king, can prevent the expulsion or cutting off of the bishop, then the position is drawn (Second Basic Drawing Position)

4. If the weaker side is unable to blockade the pawn with the king on a square unavailable to the bishop, and the king is unable to prevent cutting off or expulsion of the bishop because the diagonal of action of the bishop is too small and the weaker side falls in zugzwang, then the stronger side wins.

(Second Basic Winning Position)

Other positions with the same distribution of forces can be reduced to these basic positions.

### [Next month B42P vs B!]

#### Solution to THANKSGIVING Problem.

The gist of this problem is that both sides have made 50 moves without a pawn move or a capture. Here is the solution as stated in Shakhmaty Riga, 1971, #24. The composer is N. Plaksin, from Moscow.

White is missing a black squared bishop and a rook. The first was taken by the move a7:a6, and the second by h7:g6. Black is missing only one bishop, taken on its starting square by a knight.

We suppose that castling is legal for white. Then the rook, taken by black on g6, must have passed through the present barrier of white pawns from a1 (a1-d1-d2-h2-b4-g4-g6). Thus the white pawns all moved before the rook was captured.

It is clear now that the key move here is h7:g6. - but that must have taken place before the white queen got to h8, and before the black king and queen changed places.

(Note that the bishop on b6 was taken before the rook on g6, as the black rook had to be on h6 when the capture was made, otherwise it could not get into the 'box'). So,

using the technique of retrograde analysis, we show that this reorganization of pieces was possible, and took 50 moves to accomplish...

1. Nc6-d8 (the knight from d8 moves to c6 - only the steps are retraced!) 1.... T (tempo move i.e. an indifferent move which does not affect the rest of the play) 2. Nf6-g8 T 3. Kd8-e8 T 4. Qe8-f8 Qg8-h8 5. Rh8-h7 Qh7-g8 6. Rf8-h8 Qg8-h7 7. Rh8-h6 Qh7-g8 8. T Qh6-h7 9. T Qf4-h6 10. Rh6-h8 Qd4-f4 11. Rh8-f8 (In the following retroanalysis, white makes only tempo moves, which we leave unmarked.) 12. Qg8-e8 13. Qh7-g8 14. Rf8-h8 15. Qg8-h7 16. Rh8-h6 17. Qh7-g8 18. Qh6-h7 19. Qf4-h6 20. Rh6-h8 21. Rh8-f8 22. Ke8-d8 23. Kf8-e8 24. Kg8-f8 25. Kh7-g8 26. Rf8-h8 27. Kg8-h7 28. Rh8-h6 29. Kh7-g8 30. Kh6-h7 31. Kc5-h6 32. Kf5-e5 33. Qh6-f4 34. Qh7-h6 35. Qg8-h7 36. Rh6-h8 37. Qh7-g8 38. Rh8-f8 39. And all that to show that white and black made 50 retro-moves (without capturing or advancing of pawns) before h7:g6 was possible.

Therefore, the study is solved by the move 1. 0-0! (we have just proven its possibility), claiming a draw by the 50 move rule.

There is some merit to this move. 2.N-KB3 is often played, but the attack on the KP limits Black's choices and thus gives him less room to go wrong.

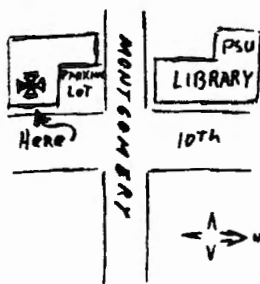
