This year's Washington Chess Federation administration has, of this writing, held office for three months. At the February 25 meeting, Vern Glaser became Vice-President and Derrick Robinson Treasurer, thus finally filling the vacancies on the board.

Despite our slow start we've so far successfully carried forward the normal functions of the WCF. For example, under the watchful eye of WCF TD Stan Scott eight competitors recently jousted for the title of Washington State Champion. As a full account will be given elsewhere in NWC, let me pause here only to congratulate the winner, Bobby Ferguson, and to comment on the spectators. As you know, chess is primarily a participation sport; nonetheless, several people enjoyed watching. In addition to many honest chess citizens, the visitors included

some infrequently seen chess aristocrats such as Ken Tomkins, Jim Blackwood and Bob Lundin, and chess royalty: GM Yasser Seirawan, IM Nikolay Minev, and IM John Donaldson. With only four draws, numerous tense time scrambles and the outcome undecided until the last move, there was plenty of excitement.

The annual Washington Open is another event proceeding on schedule. We have been very fortunate this year in obtaining a bid from the Student Union at Western Washington University for this tournament. Three goals of the WCF are furthered: (1) To re-establish the Washington Open as a grand three day event; (2) To broaden the sponsorship of state events; (3) To hold more open tournaments outside of the Seattle/Tacoma area. The latter is especially important this year in that it appears that Peter Dessaules may be taking a sabbatical from one of the state's most popular tournaments, the Columbia Cup in Richland.

The "1987 Washington Open at Western Washington University," near Bellingham, May 23,24,25, promises to be a perfect warm-up for the 1987 U.S. Open. The organizers have arranged a healthy prize fund, pleasant site, good TD and are throwing in some extras such as unique trophies and club and team championships. The latter will not affect the normal progress or pairings of the tourney but allows players' points to be counted towards their team's total for a little extra fun - a playful side-bet, as it were. For extra fun between rounds the organizers are attempting to induce computer game, computer software, and video distributors to display their increasingly interesting chess wares in the large analysis room, along with the normal array of beloved booksellers. (If interested in displaying, please contact me.)

In relation to this tournament I will be sending informative material to all the chess clubs in the state. In that mailing I plan to include a detailed questionnaire; I believe a statewide inventory of chess resources will be very useful in aiding local clubs. Presently we have addresses for these clubs: Olympic, Kitsap, Tacoma, Grays Harbor, Boeing, Greenlake, Seattle, Cowlitz, Lewis County, Willapa, Valley, Tri-Cities, Inland Empire, Yakima. Clubs we've missed and interested school groups and league teams are invited to send me a mailing address. Questions and advice are also welcome.

I would like to hear from anyone interested in devising, or participating in, a method (or methods) of statewide representation in the WCF. For example, Ohio is sectioned into geographical areas with a "trustee" responsible for each area. We need something of this sort to enhance communication and compensate for the unbalanced concentration of chessplayers in the Seattle area. I would like to try some such system on an informal basis for a year or two, then incorporate it into the WCF if it proves effective.

If all goes well, the next world championship match will take place in October. Let's try to get Shelby Lyman's program on the match into as many TV stations in the state as we can. I've been collecting material from local and national media (i.e., the P.I.'s excellent coverage of the last match and the striking full-page picture of Kasparov in the Jan '87 LIFE) to demonstrate to program managers that there is, indeed, widespread interest in chess. Contributions to this "scrapbook" would be helpful (photo-copy is fine). Since many letters to the educational stations would offer the best chance of achieving our goal, we are attempting to organize letterwriting campaigns. Those interested please contact me.

Even a cursory knowledge of our human resources, in terms of organizing and instructing, combined with the direct experience of kids' enthusiasm for chess tells me that this state may be ripe for a major scholastic program that would enrich the whole chess community. The WCF has a long history of involvement in junior chess; other organizations, such as the Tacoma Chess Institute, are doing their part. But I think it may be time for a full-scale statewide effort on our part to plant the seeds of chess in schools where it lies fallow and help nourish it in schools where it already blooms. (Did you know that there is almost no elementary school chess activity in the whole of Seattle?) Again, I request contact from those interested.

The WCF is at an ebb right now - membership is low. However I am not inclined to seek abstract support; my concern is in improving the usefulness of the Federation. In some of the above paragraphs I have asked for aid for specific projects I believe beneficial to chess and chessplayers in the state of Washington. On the whole, the present board members of the WCF are interested in aggrandizement neither for themselves nor for the WCF. We are interested in doing something for chess and chessplayers. I am sure there are many like-minded individuals out there. Won't you join us in this effort?

Birth of a Tournament

Few players and/or organizers realize the many services that the OCF can provide in organizing, sponsoring, and publicizing a chess tournament held in Oregon. The OCF can act as the sponsoring USCF affiliate by co-sponsoring or sponsoring the event, thus saving the organizer of one or two events a year the \$30 cost of USCF affiliation. The OCF can provide advance funds to pay for CHESS LIFE and NWC Tournament Announcements, preparation and mailing of flyers, and possible site rental deposits, such funds to be repaid from tournament entry fees. The OCF has a bulk mailing permit out of Portland. Properly prepared material (minimum of 200 pieces) can be mailed at the rate of 14 cents per piece from Portland. Also, tournament flyers can be printed, addressed and mailed for 26 cents per piece with a minimum of 200 and maximum of 500 pieces. Incidental to my duties as OCF Secretary-Treasurer, I maintain a computerized database of Oregon chessplayers. Organizers or clubs desiring a list of names and addresses of current OCF and/or USCF members in their area can send me a self-addressed stamped envelope (OCF, 1135 14th Street, Astoria, OR 97103). A complete list of all known Oregon players, including former and current OCF members, USCF members and OMSI players is available for \$1.00 to cover costs of mailing and photocopying. Self-sticking mailing labels are also available; contact me for details. The OCF Board of Directors collectively have over 50 years of experience in organizing, sponsoring and directing chess tournaments. We are always willing to give advice and assistance in determining tournament structure and preparing tournament budgets. If you need a USCF certified Tournament Director, the OCF Board of Directors will help you locate one. We can arrange for the use of USCF Rating Supplements. The Linn-Benton Open (LBO) is an example of what the OCF can do. At the Oregon Open last September Dan Rogers asked me why there aren't more tournaments in the Corvallis-Albany area. I suggested that he locate a site and ask the OCF to sponsor a tournament there. (Article XIII, Section 6 of the OCF Bylaws requires that the OCF sponsor chess tournaments anywhere in Oregon where there is sufficient demand, provided that a member requests that a tournament be held there and provides the address of at least one possible site.) To my surprise, in less than three weeks Dan did this and more. He located a site and made a tentative reservation. He provided a suggested less than three weeks Dan did this and more. He provided a suggested tournament format (tournament name, prize structure, number of rounds, number of sections, entry fee, and time control) and volunteered his services as tournament director. Since there was time pressure involved (i.e., the Oct 15th deadline for publication of the TA in the Dec issue of CHESS LIFE), I phoned Dan to discuss some necessary details. The I polled the OCF Board of Directors by phone to determine if the OCF was willing to sponsor the LBO. The vote was 5 in favor and 2 not at home, and the TA was in the mail the next day. and the TA was in the mail the next day.

I agreed to act as the OCF representative and Dan and I worked lagreed to act as the OUR representative and Dan and I wonked out a formal agreement detailing responsibilities concerning the LBO. The OCF agreed to sponsor the tournament, be responsible for all financial obligations arising from the LBO, prepare tournament announcements for NWC, loan Dan USCF rating supplements, provide necessary tournament directing supplies, and prepare and mail at least 200 flyers advertising the event to chessplayers in nearby cities. Dan agreed to become a USCF

certified Club director before the tournament, direct it, collect and forward entry fees and memberships from the tournament, and prepare an article for NWC. The result of this cooperative effort was a very successful Linn-Benton Open.

If you live in Oregon and you would like to see a chess tournament held in your town, find a site, contact any member of the OCF board of Directors (our names and addresses can be found in most issues of NWC), and the OCF will do as much of the rest as you like. Since, at the present time, the OCF financial resources are somewhat limited, there is one stipulation. Any tournament sponsored by the OCF must be structured so that it will financially break even in the opinion of a majority of the OCF Board of Directors. OCF Board of Directors.

U.S. OPEN HISTORY

At the 1985 U.S. Open in Hollywood, Florida, Yasser Seirawan won his first seven games, then took four draws and another win to capture the first place trophy on tie-breaks over Boris Spassky and Joel Benjamin. 498 players competed in the tournament.

Among Yaz's other achievements in the past two years was second place at the 1985 Interzonal in Switzerland and clear first place in the 1986 U.S. Championship. He is a candidate for President of the USCF in the 1987 elections.

At the '85 Open, he defeated Arthur Bisguier in 24 moves. Bisguier won the U.S. Open Championship in 1950, 1956, and 1959.

1987 WASHINGTON HIGH SCH TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

The number before the slash is the points scored; after the slash is the opposing team number. Solkoff tie-breaks, adding opponents' scores.

This year's team tournament, held at Mariner High School between Everett, saw 171 avid high schoolers (including alternates who may have played only one round) fighting for ten trophies, some medals, certificates, and other prizes. The site (Mariner Coach Ric Peeps, host) was perfect: the Mariner gym (one of those quiet floors), with lots of side space where skittlers and speed demons could go, and from which they could watch the competition through windows. After five rounds and eighteen plus housrs of chess, Shorewood, in its first year with a chess program, took the honors. Many observers suspected that with the move of the Schmeck-LaF unit to Shorewood from Shoreline, closed in June 1986, the new team would develop quickly. But not even the team members believed after their third in Metro League, that they could win it all. The Shorewood team: Chris Schmeckle, Calvin Creger, William Hung, Young-Sae Song and Stefan Persson, coached by Ollie LaFreniere and trained by Matt Edwards. Shorewood won their first two rounds 5-0 and were never headed thereafter, concluding four full points ahead of the field. Each player, except Schmeckle with only a draw, gave up only one point of five. On the way to victory, Shorewood defeated two league champions four to one.

Second place is headed by Harold Miklander, a Danish exchange student and a member of the Danish national team. He taught his team well this year, with opportunities provided by Louie Hamm, coach. Roosevelt, with Miklander making Schmeeckle's point unsure (the game was an interesting draw), tied Shorewood and outpointed all other opposition. The other Roughriders: Simon Chow, Peter Pan, Amos Latteier, Frank Itoll.

O'Dea surprised everyone, arriving at third, and had a good deal of pairings luck as well. This would have been a good year for O'Dea had they not had to give up a forfeit match in the Metro League, and they confirmed this by performing well at State. The O'Dea players: Mike Marley, Matt Badley, Roy Simperman, John Kenny, Joe Calacat. The O'Dea coach is Barrett Corrigan.

After Seattle's Metro league took the first three places, TAPCO's Wilson picked up fourth. Laboring mightlly on the upper tables the whole tournament, Coach Jerry Thorpe's "Vietnamese Attack Squad" pulled fifteen points. A few of these young men are only in school for chess, and with instruction, their tenacious play will bring them success. Wilson: Phat Nguyen, Jerome Brown, Mo Nguyen, Cuong Nguyen, Margaret Goodro. Wilson was TAPCO champion.

Cascade, WESCO League champions, took fifth place. More was expected of this first place seed, but the points just didn't come. Al Frasch coaches Cascade: David Roper, Todd Gilbert, Mark Coates, Pete Diemert, Kim Fricke.

A surprise in the tournament was the performance of Garfield, Metro League champions and defending titlist. They were blown out in the last round by Shorewood and could garner only 14 points for ninth place.

Best board performances were as follows: Board 1: Trevor Gulick, perfect score, Snohomish. Board 2: Sam Elder, perfect score, Federal Way. Board 3: 4.5 points of 5, Peter Pan, Roosevelt, Robert Dixon, Mountlake Terrace, and Joshua Teeter, Mariner. Board 4: perfect scores, Ranella Estrella, Franklin and Eric Shen, Lakeside. Board 5: perfect scores, Eric Slane, Kentridge, Paul Choi, Federal Way and Scott Sandwick, Garfield.

In the annual coaches' meeting coaches directed the High School Director to support the annual Oregon-Washington Interstate match (following each state's team championship tournament) with a venue in Washington in 1988. The coaches expressed confidence in current tournament organization and operation practices and gave the right to interpret player eligibility rules to the high school director and the tournament director. Ollie LaFreniere was re-elected High School Director by acclamation. The coaches supported LaFreniere's decisions to use high school tournament funds as he thought best to aid high school chess and its players. The tournament produced a profit of \$206.99. The total residual in high school funds is now \$294.56.

The 1988 State Team tournament was set for February 26-27 at Mountlake Terrace High School, north of Seattle. (Editor's note: Mountlake Terrace hopes to have three exchange students next year, one each from the Soviet Union, West Germany, and Japan. We then sort of joked about who would be playing on boards 4 and 5 next year!)

As in all tournaments organized by LaFreniere, adequate secretarial help was a hallmark. Secretaries John A. Scott, Andrew Shogren and Lisa Benzon worked hard. Wall charts were quickly posted, the rating reports were ready to mail Monday, and tournament directors Bob Karch and Hanniegn Pitre (JV section) were able to be on the floor where the action was.

TD Bob Karch came up with this idea last year; it was a good one and High School Director LaFreniere at once organized the tournament concurrent with high school team. In this tournament, alternates who come with their team can compete for prizes, and still substitute for varsity players in the main event, taking a half point bye in the JV tournament for a round. Coaches are delighted to see their younger players get some tournament experience.

Hanniegn Pitre again directed a seventy player event. He commented that there was some pretty terrible chess out there. But they have to start somewhere.

Angel Aguado was the only player to score five points. The young man from Lake Washington HS took home a nice first place trophy. Tied at 4.5 (Solkoff tie-breaks) were Scott Hungerford, Garfield, second, and Aaron, Lake Washington, third. There followed third place Phil Rogers, Everett, and I-Chen Chao, Roosevelt, at four points. All received trophies.

Class certificates were also awarded. Best senior: Khoi Bui, 4 points, Lindbergh; Best Junior: Khoat Vo, 4, Wilson: Best sophomore: Matt Mead, 4, Snohomish; Best freshman: Tohun Kim, 3, Bellarmine Prep.

Director Pitre extrapolated team scores, based on best three scoring players from a school, to award three team trophies. First team was Lake Washington with 13 points. Second was Garfield, 11.5 and third was Snohomish with 10 points.

Sweet Home successfully defended its title in the Oregon High School Team Championships held Feb 27-28 at Rex Putnam High School in Milwaukie. It was a close fight for first between Sweet Home and Wilson, and Beaverton. Both Sweet Home and Wilson finished with 3.5 points, then tied-breaks took over. Grant drew both Wilson and Beaverton, but those tough matches must have tired out the Grant team, as they got steamrollered by Milwaukie 5-0 in the last round. Beaverton drew Sweet Home in the last round; another half point would have given Beaverton the championship. Catlin Gabel had the toughest last two rounds, having to play Sweet Home and Wilson in succession. They well may be the team to watch next year.

In the B division, Oregon Episcopal was first, Aloha taking second. The individual tournament was won by Tim Coffey of Cleveland, Art Adams of the same school finished second. Host for the event was Paul Boring. Mike Olson and I directed.

Besides the winner of the individual competition, who finished 5-0, only one player in the team event had a 4-0 score: Bobby Anderson, 4th board for Wilson. Thirty participated in the individual tourney, and 12 teams in the B competition. The team that traveled farthest was Henley from Klamath Falls.

Chess in Eugene, Oregon??! Yes, that's right, we are having chess tournaments in Eugene, Oregon again, our first since the Oregon Category Championships of Feb, 1985 (two years ago)! The Eugene Open was held at the University of Oregon in the Student Union Building. The tournament was sponsored by the Lane County Chess Club (Eugene) and directed by Michael Vaughn. We drew 28 players from 2 states! Bobby Ferguson (2255) came down from Seattle to visit his girlfriend and play in the tournament. Dave Arganian (2211), a University of Oregon law student from East Lansing, Michigan was the other Master in the event.

The tournament winners were Arganian of Eugene, Jay T. Collins (2167) of Eugene, and Stuart Warren (1936) of Eugene. Each player had a score of 3.5 out of 4.0 to the for first place overall. Congratulations! Other winners were: 2nd Quartile, Dan Rogers (1836) of Albany, OR and Robert Haselden (1795) of Trail, OR; each player had 3 points. For the 3rd Quartile, Charles Haselden (1542) also of Trail, OR won it outright!—with 3 points. In the 4th Quartile, Michael Connelly (unr) of Eugene, OR won it outright with 2 points! Chess News From Roseburg Report By Gerald E. Barker

Roseburg Chess Club Tournament II went smoothly, participation was up 10% over our first tournament with 22 players. As tournament director I was concerned that we might have more players than we had seating for; we had table space for 24. In light of Charles Geary's letter advocating our time controls, 40/1, 30SD, and hoping we could draw 100 players, and the fact that I had already received four times the advanced entries of our first tourney, I checked on renting a few tables. As it turned out we had a nice fun tournament and everyone seemed to have a good time.

The clear winner with 4.5 was Michael Vaughn from Dorena, representing the Lane County Chess Club. Second place was a 3-way tie at 4 between Mark Turner, Dan McLeod, and Thomas Knackstedt. There were some good games and not so good but I don't think the faster time controls were in any way a detriment to the quality of chess that was played.

SPOKANE CHESS CLUB

Report By David L. Collyer

Ben Fitch captured his first Spokane Chess Club Championship by destroying a strong field 6-0. As the highest-rated player, Fitch was expected to contend for first place, but his method of victory demonstrated his superior skill and preparation.

Ben was born and raised in the greater New York area, attended college at Northwestern in Chicago, and is employed as principal oboist for the Spokane Symphony. He learned the moves at age ten and played in his first rated tournament in 1982. His initial rating was in the 1200's.

Ben inched over the 1800 level in early 1986 and, with his victory in our club championship, will climb into the 2000 bracket. A short phone interview with Ben gleaned the following:

Books he found helpful include Pachman's Books he found helpful include Pachman's series on tactics, strategy, and pawn play; THE ART OF ATTACK by Vukovic; TEST YOUR TACTICAL ABILITY, and material covering Fischer and Seirawan. He is an avid fan of postal chess, playing in both USCF and ICCF sections. This activity, in conjunction with seeking tournaments in which strong players compete, helped Ben progress as rapidly as he did.

His opening preferences have evolved from 1 e4 as White to offbeat choices such as 1 b3 or 1 Nc3 and then back to 1 e4. He enjoys the French and Nimzovitch against 1 e4, and prefers ...e6 as Black against 1 d4, transposing into a Dutch or Slav strategy. His personal study time is divided equally between openings and endgames. To keep current, Ben finds NEW IN CHESS magazine to be very helpful. Dave Ross opens with Bishop's Opening, quickly transposing into the Piano. The idea behind Bc4 is to lure Black into placing his KB on c5 and then play a Ruy Lopez type pawn storm against the 'misplaced' Black Bishop. (Editor: But note that after move 6, Black has 4 pieces developed and White only 2; after 10 moves it is White 4, Black 6.) Ross begins his pawn storm with his King as yet uncastled but safe. Viktors looks the situation over and, sacs a Bishop to mobilize the Knight on d4! The Knight hop gains tempo against the Queen on e2 and we are wondering if the huddle of White pieces on c1/c2/d1/d2/e1 a mass or a target? Viktors exchanges Bishop for the Knight on f3 and Ross automatically recaptures 15 gxf3. And spends an hour considering his next move. Analysis indicates that the way to refute the attack was 12 Nxf3. After 12...Nb3 13 Bxb3 Rxd1 + 14 Bxd1 Qxb4 + and ...Qxe4 Black would have Queen, Knight, Rook and 7 pawns vs White's 2 Rooks, 2 Bishops, Knight and 4 pawns. Still, here Black's attack is broken. Now, however, the game becomes a question of White's King's safety. Each side has 12 minutes to make 24 moves. Would you trade your King's safety for a piece in such time trouble? The game gets away from theoretical forcing moves as Vik turns his game into lasting pressure. Ross loses on time as he makes the losing 39 Kg1, allowing ...Nxf6+ with the discovered attack on the White Queen. Uncle Vik's time pressure looks like his best weapon.


